Rhodes Orchid Odyssey 31st March - 7th April 2024 Led by Yiannis Christofides and Sotiris Alexiou

Day 1

Arrival at Diagoras airport on Rhodes. Yiannis collected Karlheinz and Anna from the airport and also Tiina, Jaak and Robin who had already arrived here in the days before, and set off towards our village base for the week. Our first roadside stop produced masses of *Ophrys cornutula* in good flower.

We continued to the mountains, stopping at a forested area of *Pinus brutia* and *Cupressus sempervirens* to explore by a track. We found tall *Ophrys mammosa*, followed by *Ophrys regis-ferdinandii*, *Ophrys sicula*, *Ophrys blitopertha*, *Ophrys reinholdii*, one specimen of *Ophrys speculum* that was over and *Ophrys reinholdii*. Sotiris collected Rachael, Elizabeth, Robert, Rosamund, Adron and Sue, and stopping at the first location also found *Ophrys polyxo* and *Ophrys halia*.

Day 2

We assembled at 9.00am for a briefing and then set off due south. The weather was sunny and warm. We slowly descended, observing the landscape changing from pine forest to garigue. Our first stop was at a beach where we saw many of the typical garigue plants, such as *Cistus creticus, C. salviifolius, C. parviflorus, Alkanna tinctoria, Teucrium brevifolium,* the



endemic Campanula rhodia, Rumex bucephalophorus and Ononis natrix.

Our next stop was on a hillside with low cushion plants. *Asphodelus ramosus, Asphodelus fistulosus* and *Glebionis coronaria* were in full flower. We first searched a cultivated field finding *Ophrys speculum* in good flower. We then searched the hillside, finding *Anacamptis pyramidalis,*



Anacamptis coriophora subsp. fragrans, Ophrys parvula, Ophrys cinereophila, Ophrys cretica subsp. beloniae, Ophrys regis-ferdinandii, Ophrys calypsus and Ophrys iricolor. We found many other plants as well, such as Pallenis spinosa, Blackstonia perfoliata and bright red Ranunculus asiaticus.

We then drove a short distance and stopped for lunch at a little church. Here we saw more *Ophrys cretica* subsp. *beloniae*, *Ophrys regis-ferdinandii*, *Ophrys cornutula* and *Serapias carica*. *Cytinus hypocistis* was seen near a *Cistus* plant.

Our next stop was a nearby roadside, where we

found some new orchids such as *Ophrys blitopertha*, *Ophrys lutea*, *Ophrys dodekanensis* and *Ophrys bilunulata* subsp. *punctulata*. We continued to search similar places, stopping to see a field full of *Gladiolus italicus*. We came to a stop by the sea, where some people dipped their toes in the water, while the rest enjoyed the sunshine.

Day 3

It was sunny and warm today as we headed back to the south of the island but then followed a course that took us inland and high on a hill with a commanding view of the coast all around us. The hill was covered with scrubby vegetation that, at first glance may have seemed unpromising, but on closer inspection was hiding a wide variety of orchids, including some new ones in their

midst. We saw Ophrys tenthredinifera, Ophrys ferrum-equinum, Ophrys cornutula, Ophrys reinholdii, Ophrys halia, Ophrys omegaifera, Anacamptis papilionacea, Orchis anatolica, Orchis provincialis and others. Other plants seen there included Helianthemum apenninum, Paeonia clusii subsp. rhodia, Fritillaria rhodia and Polygala monspeliaca. We moved lower down and searched again, finding the same orchids but also Ophrys bombyliflora.

We continued, stopping for lunch on the outskirts of one of the villages. We then got back on the tarmac road and headed north. We stopped to see Blue Rock Thrush, and had good views of a pair sitting high on a rock face. Our final stop was near the sea, where we found *Parentucellia viscosa*, *Bellardia trixago*, *Anacamptis fragrans* and *Anacamptis pyramidalis*.



Day 4

Another sunny and warm day. We crossed the island to the east coast making our first stop to look for *Anacamptis laxiflora*. Our first orchids were *Ophrys bombyliflora*, followed by *O. cornutula*, *Anacamptis laxiflora* and *Serapias politisii*. We also saw *Linaria pelisseriana* and the last flowers of *Anemone coronaria*. We continued to the coast and stopped in some olive groves where we saw *Ophrys colossaea* and also *Ophrys mammosa*, *Ophrys rhodia* and *Ophrys heldreichii subsp. polyxo*. *Bellardia trixago* and *Parentucellia* viscosa were common here. Many *Serapias politisi* were found throughout the area. We then drove due south and took our lunch in an area of olive groves further inland and then moved to a nearby area were we found red *Ranunculus asiaticus* and many *Serapias carica* and *Ophrys cornutula*. Two *Orchis anthropophora* were also seen.

Day 5



Our good weather continued today as we set off to the mountains. We stopped in the foothills and explored the area there finding *Ophrys sicula, Ophrys candica, Ophrys reinholdii* and *Cyclamen rhodium*. Moving higher up we saw *Ophrys omegaifera* and the first flowers of *Limodorum abortivum*. Green-underside Blue, Green Hairstreak and Eastern Festoon butterflies were on the wing. We continued on our way stopping just outside a village, to look at another beautiful Rhodian orchid, *Ophrys lucis*.

Our next stop was at the foot of the mountain, where we had our picnic. This is an area dominated by *Cupressus sempervirens* and *Pinus brutia*. The understory is carpeted with *Anemone blanda* and *Cyclamen rhodium*. We found *Ophrys reinholdii, Ophrys oreas, Ophrys dodekanensis, Ophrys ferrumequinum* and *Neotinea maculata*.

We then moved higher up the hill where a different set of orchids awaited us. We found beautiful *Anacamptis picta* and

Neotinea lactea in good flower. Also more Orchis provincialis, Ophrys omegaifera and Ranunculus paludosus. We spend considerable time exploring the area before setting off in the afternoon on the return journey, stopping to see Centaurea lactucifolia in flower.

Day 6

It was sunny and warm again today. We set off inland, stopping at a woodland roadside to explore. This was not very fruitful so we moved on again. Our next stop produced *Silene* salamandra and one flowering specimen of the beautiful *Dianthus critinus* and *Erodium* cicutarium.

Our next stop was at a lake, where we searched the scree for specialist plants, finding Campanula

rhodensis, Gypsophila confertifolia, Trifolium grandiflorum, Scilla hyacinthoides © Sotiris Alexiou Ornithogalum narbonense, Allium junceum, Serapias politisii and Linum virgultorum. Little Ringed Plover and Wood Sandpiper, as well as Fresh Water Crab were seen near the lake. We had our picnic at the lakeside and then we continued, stopping at a nearby site to see more Orchis italica and also finding Aristolochia guichardii.

We made a brief stop to photograph Scilla hyacinthoides and Scarce Swallowtail and continued on the road, where we made our last stop, finding Ophrys rhodia, Orchis anatolica and Ornithogalum nutans.

Day 7

The morning began at the base of one of the mountains, where we walked a woodland track to explore. We found Neotinea maculata and Ophrys candica. We wandered here for a short while before returning to the vehicles. We then drove to one of the islands numerous castle ruins, and continued past it to a

beach where we had our lunch. On our return the hotel we stopped and explored the castle and its commanding views.

Day 8

It was departure day today. Yiannis took the first to depart and then continued for a little exploration before meeting with Matt who took those departing by ferry to the port of Rhodes.
